Department of Biological and Agricultural Engineering Policy on Change of Curriculum Admission for Undergraduate Students

Students within Texas A&M University, to include TAMU Galveston

Several factors are considered in the admission decision for change of curriculum students.

These include, but are not limited to:

- 1) Number of students currently enrolled in the program for which they have applied to
- 2) The number of admitted entry-to-a-major students from the College of Engineering who will enroll in the BAEN program for the semester
- 3) The number of external transfer applicants under review

Students requesting change of curriculum from a department within Texas A&M University or Texas A&M University Galveston will be evaluated only when they have:

- 1. completed at least one semester of course work
- Completed at least one semester of course work
 Completed a minimum of 15 semester credit hours (SCH) of core math/science courses MATH151, MATH 152 (or higher), and PHYS 206 and either CHEM 107/117 (CHEM 120) or BIOL 111 (or equivalent) with a grade not less than "C"
 earned a math/science GPA of 2.50 or better
- 4. earned a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or better
- 5. no history of repeating, dropping or withdrawing from courses,
- 6. not made a grade less than "C" in any course in the previous semester

In the case of "marginal" students, math/science courses taken at TAMU are viewed more favorably than those taken elsewhere. Students who have repeated a math/science course or courses, regardless of the reason, are not viewed as favorably as those who pass the course(s) on the first attempt.

- 2. Request for change of curriculum is initiated by submitting the required application in the My Record tab in the Howdy portal – **Submit or View Change Request**.
- 3. Change of curriculum requests will be evaluated after final grades for the current semester have been posted in Howdy.
- 4. The Department reserves the right to refuse admission to any applicant who has been assigned a sanction due to academic misconduct.
- 5. Students who are accepted may be placed on "Provisional" status for a minimum of one
- 6. Provisional students must meet a set of requirements to remain in the Department. These requirements, as defined by the Department, may include but are not limited to: the number of hours taken per semester, restrictions on dropping courses, specific courses that must be taken in designated semesters, minimum grades in specific courses, and minimum overall GPÅ.
- 7. The provisions of this policy do not constitute a contract, express or implied, between any applicant, student, faculty or staff member of the Biological and Agricultural Engineering Department or Texas A&M University. This policy is for informational purposes only and should not be interpreted as a guarantee of admission if all provisions are met.
